A meeting of the Los Angeles County Board of Education was held on Tuesday, July 9, 2024 at the Los Angeles County Office of Education Board Room.

PRELIMINARY ACTIVITIES

CALL TO ORDER

Dr. Chan called the meeting to order at 3:04 p.m.

Dr. Chan read the LACOE Land Acknowledgement.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Cross led the Pledge of Allegiance.

COMMUNICATIONS: BOARD / SUPERINTENDENT

Ms. Jimena welcomed Mr. Peter, new Student Board Member and said she looks forward to working with him.

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Mr. Peter introduced himself and said that he is excited to serve on the Los Angeles County Board of Education and represent students in alternative programs.

Mr. Cross brought up a motion from the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors (BOS), where the motion advances to expand BOS from five to nine members. He said he supports the BOS proposal that would revamp county government by expanding the current amount of board members from five to nine, as well as establish the CEO as an elected position.

Ms. Foggy-Paxton said that she attended the Carnegie Institute for School Improvement in education las week and provided highlights of the event.

Ms. Forrester said she encourages the County Board taking a stand for peace in the Middle East.

Dr. Montaño agreed with Ms. Forrester and recognized her bravery for taking a stand. Dr. Montaño thanked Ms. Forrester. Dr. Montaño welcomed Mr. Peter to the County Board.

Dr. Johnson welcomed Mr. Peter to the County Board and thanked him for his time in serving on the Board. Dr. Johnson mentioned the events he has attended including the GAIN ceremony, Barry J. Nidorf Graduation, and Dr. Herczog's Retirement event.

Dr. Perez welcomed Mr. Peter to the County Board and thanked him for serving and representing students. He said he attended a Greater L.A. Foundation meeting today, where Dr. Duardo and Mrs. Foggy-Paxton also attended. He said that a lot was covered, including:

- Reinstating Ms. Gloria Rogers to the Board of Directors.
- Approving the nomination of Mr. Gary Newman on the Board of Directors.
- Approval of the 2024-25 GLA Budget
- Approval of salary compensation study for GLA.
- Approval to establish an ad-hoc Board Recruitment Committee.
- Raising Funds for projects, such as Reimagining Los Padrinos.

Dr. Perez said that he attended the first CSBA Region 14 Delegate Assembly Meeting and provided details. He encouraged board members to attend the County Board Members Services Conference in Monterey in September 2024.

Dr. Chan indicated that she was invited to speak at the BOS meeting as an individual to express her support for the BOS motion to expand board from five to nine members. Dr. Chan provided an update on the CCBE transition to CSBA governance. Dr. Chan said she would like more clarification on institutional dues and linkage to Golden Bell Awards and County Board Member Services Conference in September 2024.

Dr. Duardo, Superintendent provided the following highlights to the County Board:

CABE International Conference in Oaxaca

- A few weeks ago, I had the opportunity to join CABE for its first international conference in Oaxaca.
- It was a great cultural exchange experience

- I learned a lot what was especially fascinating to me was learning how they support their children from various indigenous cultures in the area.
- Each of the different indigenous groups speak different dialects and so schools are working to strengthen their language immersion efforts and their support to multilingual students.
- I think we can learn a lot from their model as we often serve similar students that come from indigenous backgrounds in Los Angeles County.

Teacher-2-Teacher Summer Program

- Over the last two weeks, four former Teachers of the Year in Los Angeles County joined us at Los Padrinos for a co-teaching effort with our teachers.
- This program brought in some of our best teachers in the County to learn about how we serve our students in juvenile court schools.
- We must remember that the students that are temporarily with us all go back to their district of residence.
- This was an opportunity for our teachers to learn from each other and identify new and innovative strategies for delivering instruction to our students.
- I want to thank the Teachers of the Year that participated and shared two weeks of their summer vacation learning with us.
- I also want to thank our four LP teachers that participated in this exchange program.

Summer Programming at Los Padrinos

- Yesterday was the launch of our summer programming at LP.
- We are starting with the Sports/Arts/Drumline/Entrepreneurial Summer Camp.
- This camp will be going until July 19th.

The Superintendent recommends that the County Board approve the acceptance of the Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI) Evidence-Based Practices and Community-Defined Evidence Practices Grant Program Round 5: Early Intervention Programs and Practices from Heluna Health, for LACOE's Mental Health and School Counseling Unit.

The program provides multi-tiered mental health support to LACOE's specialty high schools, community schools, and court schools and training and technical assistance to the 80 school districts and 360 charter schools in LA County on developing a multi-tiered system of support (MTSS) framework for student well-being.


