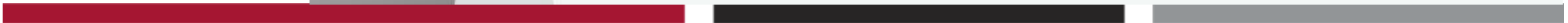
The Los Angeles County Board of Education will acknowledge LACOE staff that served as mentors and made the mentoring program a success.

- **Learn and Earn Mentor Program** is a school-based, after-school program that promotes academic success, career exploration and pro-social behaviors, and provides an opportunity to earn money. The Program runs for 5 weeks in the months of July through August.
- The LACOE Post Office call for volunteer mentors is released in June that includes a link to register
 - **Virtual** 2x week for 1hr per session for 5 weeks
 - Ratio of 1-1 or 1-2
 - Guest Speakers Sessions run 3 of the 5 weeks
 - **Stipends can be Earned**
 - *\$25 per session for attendance and participation*
 - *\$25 for guest speaker notes*
 - *\$50 for final project (poster board)*
 - *\$300 can be earned in total*

WHEREAS, The LACOE Community Schools Initiative was established during the 2019 - 2020 school year, where LACOE Community School staff were co-located in 15 school sites across 15 school districts across Los Angeles County to implement the community schools strategy. Since then, the LACOE Community Schools Initiative has expanded into a total of 25 school sites;

WHEREAS, In 2022, the California Legislature, the Governor, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the State Board of Education identified establishing community schools as a key pandemic recovery strategy and a critical equity framework for our education system. The state announced its investment of \$4.1 billion to support and expand the California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP). These allocations serve as the largest Community School investments in the nation;

WHEREAS, Over 460 schools in the Greater Los Angeles region are CCSPP Implementation grantees, making up roughly 20% of all grantees in the state and the largest concentration of community schools in the nation. LACOE was named one of eight Regional Transformational Assistance Centers (R-TAC) in the state to support prospective and current grantees in successful implementation of community schools;

WHEREAS, California's Community Schools address and reverse persistent racial and socio-economic educational outcome disparities exacerbated by the pandemic and are a whole child, family and community strategy for school transformation;

WHEREAS, California Community Schools are rooted in four cornerstone commitments—assets-driven and strengths-based, racially just and restorative school climates, powerful, culturally proficient and relevant instruction, and shared decision making and participatory practices;

WHEREAS, Community schools that provide integrated student support, well-designed and expanded learning opportunities informed by rigorous culturally proficient and relevant classroom instruction, promote a culture of safety and belonging, and active family and community engagement that use collaborative leadership have positive academic and nonacademic outcomes;

WHEREAS, LACOE is joining a national Community School Coordinators Appreciation Week, with the Institute for Educational Leadership Coalition for Community Schools, to celebrate and lift up Coordinators across the country;

WHEREAS, Community School Coordinators facilitate and provide leadership for the collaborative process and development of a system of supports and opportunities for youth, families, and others within a school’s community that allow all students to learn and the community to thrive;

WHEREAS, Community School Coordinators are the key to successful community schools, creating, strengthening, and maintaining the bridge between the school and community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Los Angeles County Board of Education joins Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools Dr. Debra Duardo in declaring September 15 - 21, 2024, as “Community School Coordinators Appreciation Week” in order to salute the vital role Community School Coordinators play in community schooling to promote equity, inclusivity, and empowerment to ensure students, staff, families and communities are seen, valued, and supported in our Los Angeles County schools.

VII. Recommendations

- A. Adoption of Board Resolution No. 7: 2024-25 Textbooks and Instructional Materials Sufficiency for Special Programs Support, County Community Schools, and Transformation and Educational Programs (10-Month and 12-Month Schools)

The Superintendent recommends that the Board approve Board Resolution No. 12: 2024-25, reaffirming that the governing board held a public hearing on September 10, 2024, and fulfilled all requirements of Education Code section 60119 and SB 550 that require a public hearing to be held prior to the eighth week after school begins.

The local governing board is required to hold a public hearing, prior to the eighth week after school begins, to encourage participation of parents, members of the community, teachers, and bargaining unit leaders interested in the affairs of the school district. The governing board shall make a determination through a resolution as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has, or will have, sufficient standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials, or both, in each core subject that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the State Board of Education.

REPORT:

Report on Textbooks and Instructional Materials Sufficiency for Special Programs Support, County Community Schools, and Transformation and Educational Programs.

This report has been written exclusively for the LACOE JCS schools and Specialized high schools that began school on August 12, 2024, to demonstrate the extent to which the requirements have been met to certify that each pupil has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both.

Education Code Section 60119 (c)(1): “For the purpose of this section, ‘sufficient textbooks or instructional materials’ means that each pupil, including English learners, has a standards-aligned textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home. This paragraph does not require two sets of textbooks or instructional materials for each pupil.” (c)(2): “Sufficient textbooks or instructional materials as defined in paragraph (1), does not include photocopied sheets from only a portion of a textbook or instructional materials copied to address a shortage.”

In addition to the above definition, the Education Code states that sufficient textbooks and instructional materials must be consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the state board.

Sufficiency reports were completed by the site principal or assistant principal, with input from teachers, along with a copy of the 2024-25 Board-Approved Textbook/Instructional Materials Adoptions List (Board approved on September 10, 2024).

All of the LACOE JCS schools, County Community Schools, and Specialized high schools were found to be sufficient for the 2024-25 school year, and each PAU reported that they have the Williams Uniform Complaint Procedure form posted at all sites. The tables below provide a summary of the sufficiency status for 2024-25.

WHEREAS the governing board of the Los Angeles County Office of Education hereby certifies that as of September 10, 2024, each pupil enrolled in the LACOE JCCS schools, County Community Schools, and Specialized high schools has been provided with California standards-aligned textbooks or basic instructional materials in each of the following areas:

- Mathematics
- Science
- History-Social Science
- Reading/Language Arts, including the English Language development component of an adopted program

For students in 6-8, the instructional materials were purchased from an approved, standards-aligned state adoption list as required by CCR, Title 5,

Section 9531 (textbook/instructional materials for 2024-25 adopted at the August 13, 2024, Board meeting).

For students in grades 9-12, the instructional materials were adopted by the local governing board following district review of the materials and their alignment with state content standards as required by CCR, Title 5, Section 9531 (textbook/instructional materials for 2024-25 adopted at the August 13, 2024, Board meeting).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that for the 2024-25 school year, the Los Angeles County Office of Education has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.

BE IT HEREBY ORDERED that the Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools, whose name and signature are indicated below, shall be, and hereby authorized as, our representative to sign said agreement on behalf of the Los Angeles County Office of Education.

The Superintendent recommends that the County Board of Education discuss and approve the Expenditure Plan and the first Annual Report for Proposition 28: Arts and Music in Schools grant apportionment from the California Department of Education (CDE).

Proposition 28 funds are designated by the California State Legislature intended to fund education programs, including staff, training, supplies, and partnerships. The 2023-24 estimated entitlements are based on the 2022-23 pupil enrollment and pupils eligible for Free and Reduced Price Meals (FRPM). The School Allocation and Expenditure Plan is included in the attached report. The following Prop 28 grant funding stipulations apply:

- Requires a board-approved Annual Report submitted through the CDE Arts and Music in Schools portal and posted on LACOE's website.
- No more than one percent of funds received may be used for LACOE's administrative expenses, including costs to implement this program.
- Each school site is required to create an expenditure plan; it is not mandated to be posted on LACOE's website or submitted to the CDE.
- The statute allocates AMS funding at the school site level and prohibits the reallocation of funds to a different school site.
 - The FY 2023-24 AMS apportionment included a \$29,473 allocation to Central Juvenile Hall. LACOE is required to return this amount as it was not expended at Central Juvenile Hall due to the closure.
 - Schools may pool their AMS funds if the allocation from one school site is not used to pay for the cost of arts education programs at another.
- LACOE is subject to the requirement of at least 80 percent of AMS expenditures must be used to employ certificated or classified employees for arts education program instruction.
- LACOE is applying for a waiver to ensure that all funds are spent.
- There are no designated funds for Los Padrinos as the school, but moving forward, we anticipate an allocation of approximately \$29,000.

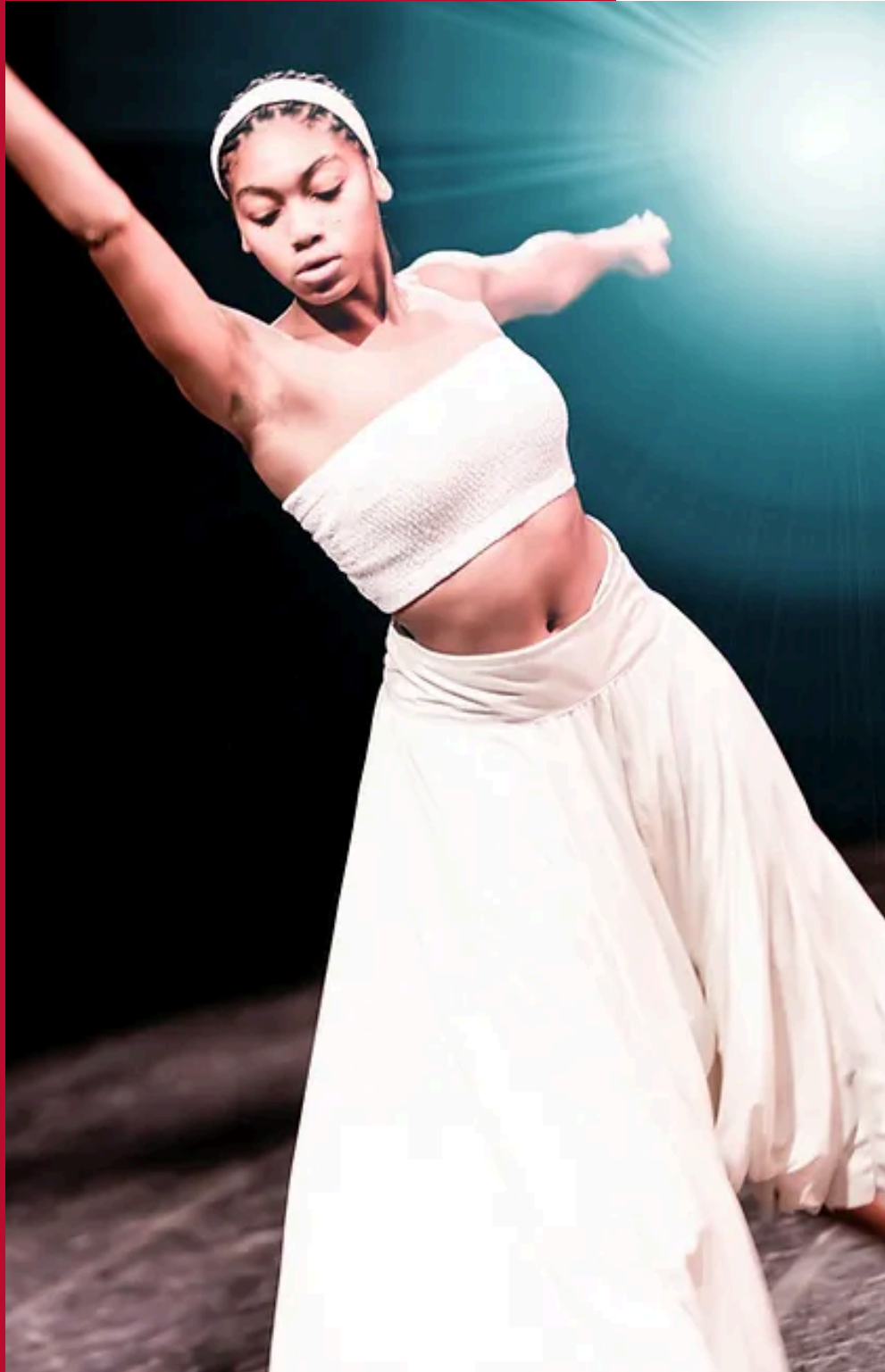

C. Approval of Discretionary Operations Block Grant – Arts, Music and Instructional Materials (AMIM) Expenditure Plan

The Superintendent recommends that the County Board of Education discuss and approve LACOE's expenditure plan for a one-time discretionary grant received from the California Department of Education (CDE) - Arts, Music, and Instructional Materials.

The California Legislature intends for these grant funds to be spent per the board- approved plan. This one-time grant was part of the 2022-23 Principal Apportionment and is distinctly separate from the Prop 28 Arts & Music in Schools restricted funding grant.

Under the CDE, block grant funds are discretionary and may be used for:

- Operational costs, including, but not limited to, retirement and healthcare cost increases
- Professional development focused on improving school climate and anti-bias
- Standards-aligned professional development and materials
- Support for arts and music education programs

Allocations are based on pupil enrollment. Funding is calculated using the 2021-22 P-2 ADA at a rate of \$642.42 per unit. LACOE received

\$498,911 for FY 22-23 and \$463,478 for FY 23-24. All funds must be encumbered prior to June 30, 2026.
